Buchanan County Visitors Center at Illinois Central Railroad Depot 1115 5th Ave. NE, Independence 319-334-3439 travelbuchanan.com

In addition to housing Buchanan County Tourism, the Depot is a museum of local railroad history. It was built in 1892 to accommodate the increasing number of passengers coming to Independence for harness racing on the nationally famous kite-shaped track built by Charles W. Williams. The site includes the station & baggage room, a 1926 90-ton steam engine and a 1978 32-ton caboose. Open seasonally mid-May through mid-October, excluding Mondays.



Barn Quilts Buchanan County Extension 319-334-7161

The Barn Quilts of Buchanan County is a project that is designed to celebrate the area's agricultural heritage by highlighting local farm buildings with beautiful, quilt-related folk art. It began in 2006 with a small committee of dedicated volunteers. In just a few short years, they had accomplished painting and placing 110 quilt blocks around the county.



Cedar Rock - Lowell and Agnes Walter Estate 2611 Quasqueton Diagonal Blvd., Independence

In 1945, Lowell and Agnes Walter commissioned world-famous architect, Frank Lloyd Wright, to create their new home. Wright designed a stunning brick, steel and glass estate perfect for entertaining complete with a River Pavilion cantilevered off a landmark rock on the banks of the Wapsipinicon River. Experience the architecture of Frank Lloyd Wright and the beauty of organic design with a tour at Cedar Rock. Tours of the property are offered seasonally mid-May into mid-October, by reservation. The Park Visitor Center offers exhibits featuring the story of the site, the architect and even an opportunity to get your photo with flat Frank. There is no entrance fee, but donations are accepted.

Ray "Bubba" Screnson created the Iowa Freedom Rock Tour as a way to honor Iowa's veterans and promote tourism across the state. Each rock depicts stories unique to that place. Buchanan County's rock, painted in the summer of **2020**, is one of the last to be completed.

Heartland Acres is a living museum of agricultural innovations, implements and displays that engage, inspire and educate visitors as they learn about our country's agricultural heritage, both in the past and present day. It includes local history exhibits curated by the Buchanan County Historical Society. Open year round; call for hours.

Historic Route 20

historic20.com () Historic US Route 20 Iowa

America's longest highway – Historic Route 20 – spans 3,365 miles across 12 states from Boston, Massachusetts to Newport, Oregon. In Iowa, the route (known locally as Historic Highway 20) passes through 35 towns including Winthrop,

Independence, and Jesup in Buchanan County. Traversing the county from east to west, it follows what was once called the Hawkeye Highway, and is now designated as County Road D220. At Jesup, on the western edge of the county, it veers north to connect with Independence Avenue leading into Waterloo. Be sure to take advantage of the photo opportunities, amenities, and attractions along this historic route.

lowa's Largest Frying Pan 802 Main Street, Brandon @Brandon Area Community Club

Brandon is home to Iowa's largest Frypan. It is an impressive nine feet wide and 14 feet long (with handle). Built in 2004 for the town's Cowboy Breakfast Festival, the skillet could fry 44 dozen eggs or 88 pounds of bacon. Have fun with this great picture taking opportunity!



Iowa Mental Health Institute 2277 Iowa Ave., Independence 319-334-2583 buchanancountyhistory.com

The Mental Health Institute (MHI) opened its doors in 1873 and is the oldest functioning psychiatric facility in the state. Enjoy exploring the beautiful architecture and grounds. The Days of Yore museum - open by appointment - tells the history of MHI from its inception and gives a picture of mental health treatment over the years.



Daniel S. Lee Mansion Next door to 805 1st St. E., Independence 319-334-4616

This historic home built in 1867, once owned by Independence first mayor and now a property of the Buchanan County Historical Society, is currently under restoration. It is a fine example of Italianate architecture. The Victorian garden to the rear is maintained by the Buchanan County Master Gardeners. Currently, it is open for viewing on specific dates or by appointment.



Littleton-Chatham Museum 1503 River Road Blvd., Independence 319-415-1175

This museum is located in the former Pleasant Grove Presbyterian Church and listed on the National Register of Historic Places. It has an exceptional display of local history that includes scale models of buildings from the early years of Littleton and Chatham. The museum is open by appointment.

Quasqueton Area Historical Museum 105 N. Water St., Quasqueton 319-934-3354 quaskyhistoricalsociety.com

319-934-3354 quaskyhistoricalsociety.com The museum features two of the cldest buildings on Water Street. The main building is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and features over 4,000 square feet of exhibits. The second building is a renovated Texaco service station featuring farm and automotive exhibits. There are dozens of photos and scrapbooks for those seeking local genealogy.

Richardson-Jakway Historic Site Jakway Forest, 2791 136th St., Aurora 319-636-2617 buchanancountyparks.com The Richardson-Jakway Historic Site tells the stories of a pioneer farmstead and early American westward migration. It includes the 1851 Richardson-Jakway House, the first frame house in Buchanan County, that is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. A trail loops around the site which includes interpretive klosks. Call to schedule a tour or visit the website to learn more about educational programs and special events.



Wapsipinicon Mill Museum 100 1st St. W., Independence 319-334-4616 buchanancountyhistory.com/mill.php Ø Wapsi Mill

The Wapsipinicon Mill, built in 1867, was once the financial hub of Independence. Today it is a historic landmark, telling the story of the town, the farms, and the people who settled in Iowa. Owned by the Buchanan County Historical Society, it is open mid-May through mid-September, Tuesday through Sunday. Call ahead for tours.

WATER TRAILS

Buchanan County Wapsipinicon River Water Trail buchanancountyparks.com

The Wapsipinicon River Corridor is among the most important natural features in Iowa. The river, with its largely intact backwater wetlands and forested bluffs, provides great habitat for fish and wildlife, and great opportunities for people to enjoy the outdoors. It is a designated a State Water Trail with signed accesses along the entire stretch and informational brochures and kiosks. Visit the website to view the water trail brochure and learn about accessing the river.



Iron Bridge Access 2707-2 Nolen Ave., Rowley buchanancountyparks.com

The Iron Bridge Access is a true Gateway to the Buchanan County Water Trail. The new paved access includes a universal launch designed for use by paddlers and boaters with various skills and physical abilities. It includes lighting and a restroom. Sidewalks allow people to access parking lots for the Guy Grover Timber and Tree Plantings wildlife area. The amenities provide access to perhaps the most scenic stretch of Wapsipinicon River Corridor. Visible upstream is the historic Iron Bridge - listed on the national Register of Historic Places.



Knott's Landing Located in Independence on Hwy. 150 South, next to the bridge.

Robert "Chic" McGlaughlin Easement Access 302 Water St., Jesup buchanancountyparks.com

Locally known as the Littleton Dam Access, The Robert "Chic" McGlaughlin Easement Access is located in the small community of Littleton. The dam is a series of rock rapids on privately owned property (please respect private property), but Iowa DNR has easement allowing public river access for fishing and paddling. The put-in below the rapids, makes for a nice half-day trip to the Iowa DNR's Otterville Bridge Access.

Three Elms Access 2041 Three Elms Park Rd., Independence buchanancountyparks.com

Three Elms Access is the last public boat access to the Wapsipinicon River before heading downstream from Independence. The concrete put-in with ample parking provides a nice half-day trip to the Iron Bridge Access, or full-day trip to the Quasqueton Campground. This is among the most scenic and popular stretches of the Wapsipinicon River Water Trail. A restroom is available at the park entrance.

Troy Mills Access 3251-3 Stewart Ave., Troy Mills buchanancountyparks.com

Troy Mills Access is the last takeout on the Buchanan County Wapsipinicon River Water Trail before the Troy Mills Dam. The access features a concrete launch and space for parking. Primitive camping is permitted. The surrounding public land contains 63 acres of forest along the Wapsipinicon River open to hunting, fishing, and other forms of low impact nature appreciation.

Wapsi River Access 2051 Wapsie Access Blvd., Independence buchanancountyparks.com

This gravel access is appropriate for paddlers and some flat-bottom motor boats, as it enters the shallows wetland and reservoir of the Wapsipinicon River above the Independence Dam. It is a takeout downstream from the Littleton or Iron Bridge accesses, and a great place to explore, fish, and paddle. There is a picnic shelter and restroom in the park.

LAND TRAILS

Buchanan County Snowmobile Trails wsaiowa.com

The Wapsipinicon Snowmobile Association maintains approximately 140 miles of trails to connect nine communities in the County. The trail system also connects with neighboring snowmobile club systems in all four directions. Trails are newly laid out every year.

American Trotter Trail Independence High School

This trail is a half mile long paved trail which connects to both the Liberty Trail and the Independence schools.

Cedar Valley Nature Trail Branard St., Brandon cedarvalleynaturetrail.com

The Cedar Valley Nature Trail is a 52-mile long recreational corridor stretching traversing through Linn, Benton, Buchanan, and Black Hawk counties. The trail head in Brandon provides access to the most scenic stretch of the trail. This segment has a firm, packed gravel surface, and portions in either direction are paved. The CVNT was a rails-trails project that converted a historic rail line into this premier trail.

Fontana Park 1883 125th St., Hazleton buchanancountyparks.com - paved and mowed

Explore this popular destination on trails that can be used year-round for walking, sking, and snowshoeing. The paved trail also provides a nice bicycle loop. Interpretive signs educate visitors about the nature of the forest, and special "Nature Play Areas" are provided as safe off-trail places for children to explore. For more information about Fontana Park see page 21.

Nature Trails - Off the Pavement Buchanancountyparks.com - mowed

Buchanan County Conservation Board manages 13 unique natural areas with maintained nature trails. Trails may go through woodlands, prairies, and along ponds and wetlands, and feature natural beauty and wildlife. For more information, visit the website.

Heritage Historical Hiking Trail 112 First St. E Independence

This walking trail winds around Independence and locates the great historical sites you can find there. To get a map go to the Independence Area Chamber of Commerce located in Downtown Independence.

Jakway Forest 2791 136th St, Aurora buchanancountyiowa.org - mowed

Jakway provides more than three miles of hiking trails in the County's largest, managed, upland forest. The trails are groomed in winter for crosscountry skiing, and equestrian use is allowed. Interpretive signs educate visitors about forest management. For more information about Jakway Forest see page 21.

Liberty Trail 1st Street West Independence by East Elementary School

This trail is on the former Rock Island RR tracks and is currently 1.5 miles and expanding.

Three Elms Area 2041 Three Elms Park Rd, Independence, IA buchanancountyparks.com - mowed

This beautiful area holds 75 wooded acres that border the Wapsipinicon River. River access is abundant at this site which has a concrete boat ramp and fishing area. Dirt mountain biking trails are maintained here with signage. There are also open areas with picnic tables that are ideal for picnicking.



Exhibits include a hands-in pond, reality watershed model, raptors wingspan board, push button sound displays, bird feeding viewing station, and much more. Outside the nature center, live animal exhibits contain bison, foxes, raccoons and many more animals. Most are housed due to having been orphaned or permanently injured. The nature center is located within Fontana Park – the County's most popular park. Nature center hours are: 8-12 Monday-Tuesday; 8-4:30 Wednesday-Friday; 1-5 Saturday-Sunday (closes at 4 p.m. during winter).

Boies Bend Area 2465 278th St., Rowley 319-636-2617

Boies Bend Area is west of Quasqueton along the Wapsipinicon River. Beautiful scenery, good fishing, and stairway access from both the river and the park trails make this a great place to visit. The park contains a picnic area with restroom, prairie planting, and woodland trails. Primitive camping is permitted.

Cortright Wildlife Area provides multiple natural areas to enjoy. Several mowed trail loops provide for great day hikes and access to various areas of the park. The 190 acres include ponds, wooded areas, prairies, tree plantings, and Wapsipinicon River shoreline. This is a premier wildlife area in the Wapsipinicon River Corridor.

Crumbacher Wildlife Area 1490 240th St., Independence 319-636-2617

The diverse, 368-acre Crumbacher Wildlife Area contains native and reconstructed prairies, forests, natural and reconstructed wetlands, and the winding Lime Creek. This is the largest county natural area, providing hiking, wildlife watching, and other nature enjoyment along maintained trails and prairie burn breaks. The area also is popular during the hunting seasons - pheasant, turkey, and deer.

Guy Grover Timber and Tree Plantings contains more than 200 acres of upland timber and lowland forest. Users can fish the quarry pond and the Wapsipinicon river shoreline, and the property is open to public hunting.

Ham Marsh 1747 Indiana Ave., Independence 319-636-2617

Ham Marsh offers 54 acres that include a marsh, sedge meadow, and a reconstructed prairie. A trail takes visitors to an observation blind overlooking the marsh, and the entire property is one of the County's best places to view and identify waterfowl and other birds. Hunting is permitted, with the exception of hunting waterfowl on the marsh.

Independence City Parks

Independence features an abundance of city parks with a variety of facilities including shelter houses, sand volleyball courts, trails, disc golf course, playground equipment, bags courses, baseball diamonds, community gardens, horseshoe courts, basketball courts, fishing access, skate & roller blade park, pavilions, and boat docks. Jakway Forest contains the county's largest public ⁴ upland forest. Several miles of woodland trails take visitors through the timber, and includes two trails with interpretive signs to inform people about the forest. Jakway also is home to the Richardson-Jakway Historic Site. The park offers disc golf, picnicking, camping, and a playground.



Koutny Pond/Hoffman Woods 1544-2 330th St., Brandon 319-636-2617

Koutny Pond is a 12-acre lake within a couple miles of Lime Creek Campground and Cedar Valley Nature Trail. A trail goes around the lake for shoreline fishing and access from two constructed jetties and includes an access for paddle craft and electric motor boats. A lake map may be downloaded at www.iowadnr.gov. Prairie covers much of the west portion of the 106 acres, with Bear Creek and Hoffman Woods on the east portion. The area is open to public hunting, fishing, and birdwatching.

Lime Creek Park is close to the Cedar Valley Nature Trail as well as Koutny Pond/Hoffman Woods. At Lime Creek you can camp, fish or go to the playground, or use the shelter house.
